The New Jersey Division of Taxation will not be supplying the library with forms this year. This is a direct result of the current economic situation, which resulted in mandated cost saving measures that the Division of Taxation must undertake. In order to attempt to accommodate our patrons, forms 1040, 1040A and 1040EZ will be available for patrons to copy. 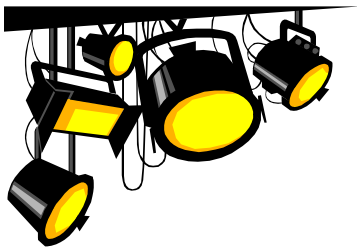

Placing Holds from Home

Our patrons will no longer need to place holds on popular titles by using the "Look What's Coming Soon" booklet. Effective January 2010, you may place holds (on the computer) on the popular titles three months in advance. Stop by the circulation desk for additional information and a list of the upcoming popular titles.

Placing a hold on library materials from home:

1. www.ftlnj.org
2. Click on Catalog Search.
3. Search for your book.
4. Click "details" next to the book you want.
5. Click "place holds"
6. Library ID: put in your entire library card number.

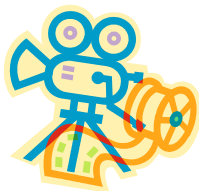

Large Print Books

The large print collection has been relocated to shelf 9 directly following the regular adult fiction collection. This shelving section is directly opposite the sitting area.

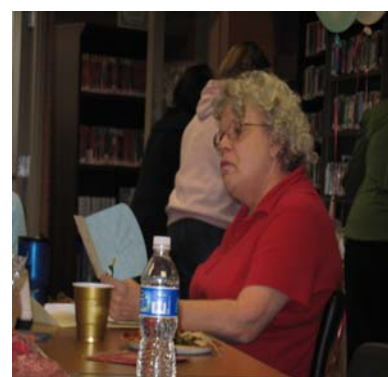
