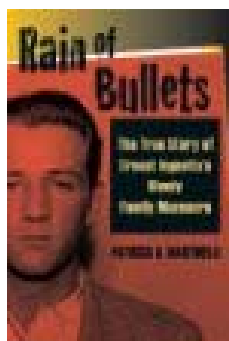

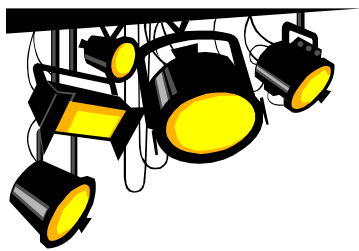
You gotta love your library!

February is love your library month, but do you know what makes it work for you? This is the first in a series of articles designed to make you aware of the people, policy and procedures that make your library work. Franklin Township Public Library is a small town library with a total of thirteen paid staff members, four full-time and nine part-time. The staff includes one professional librarian, a coordinator of children's services, a bookkeeper, a retired school media specialist, two technical troubleshooters, purchasers, catalogers, processors, a webmistress, public relations coordinators, and crafters.

Denise Saia has been the director of the Franklin Township Library since April of 1997. A resident of Hammonton, her educational background includes a BA in History from Glassboro State College in 1990, an MA in Library Science from Rowan University in 1994, and an MA in Public History from Rutgers/Camden in 2000. She was formerly employed by the *Hammonton News* for 18 years and at the Atlantic County Library System in Mays Landing as part of the extension services department for 6 years. During the weekends, Denise works as a part-time reference librarian at the Richard Stockton College. She is an active member of the New Jersey Library Association.

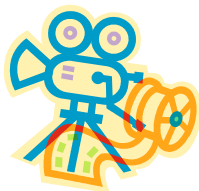
