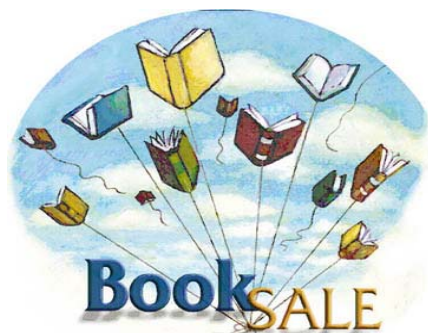


Joe and Lynn Ruiz: The Masters of Magic and Fun entertained with professional balloon sculpting and face painting.

## Placing a hold on library materials from home:

1. [www.ftlnj.org](http://www.ftlnj.org)
2. Click on Catalog Search.
3. Search for your book.
4. Click "details" next to the book you want.
5. Click "place holds"
6. Library ID: put in your entire library card number.
7. Pickup: select the library where you want to pick up the book.
8. Click "place hold".
